Children to wash hands in Intervals and dry hands with blue/Green paper towels, not the fabric towel. Soap and water is more effective than using sanitisers. An outdoor hand washing facility will be installed. Where sanitiser is used, it will contain at least 60% by alcohol (and this holds for all references to sanitiser throughout this document)

Designated members of staff to be responsible for cleaning of surfaces, door handles, toilets and outside equipment etc. throughout the day, using standard cleaning products such as detergents and bleach. As a minimum, frequently touched surfaces should be wiped down at the beginning and at the end of each day, and more frequently depending on: the number of people using the space, whether they are entering and exiting the setting, and access to hand washing and hand-sanitising facilities.

Younger children will have support if they struggle cleaning their hands independently. They will be taught how to practice these habits through songs, games.

All activities will be outdoors. In the event of rain, children will shelter in a distributed way under the

PPE (disposable apron, gloves and fluid rrepellant face masks) should be worn by staff caring for the child while they await collection if a distance of 2 metres cannot be maintained (such as for a very young child or a child with complex needs).

In an emergency, we will call 999 if they are seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk.

If a member of staff has helped someone who was unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, they do not need to go home unless they develop symptoms themselves (and in which case, a test is available through the NHS) or the child subsequently tests positive. They should wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after any contact with someone who is unwell. Cleaning the affected area with normal household disinfectant (detergent and bleach) after someone with symptoms has left will reduce the risk of passing the infection on to other people.

The manager/senior will decide, in liaison with Lambeth Public Health, whether the group of children and staff need to be sent home to isolate where a test has not been sought.

Two full sets of PPE (fluid resistant face covering, gloves, and disposable apron) will be maintained at the playground for dealing with children who become ill or require first aid and shall be replaced after use.
